Materiel Management Recognition Award – Team

THIS AWARD IS presented to a team who has demonstrated measurable successes through innovative actions, cost-effective practices, and new processes. The candidates show excellence in team cooperation and synergy, effective project management techniques and methodologies, and strong communications skills.

Winners are: Allen Frost and Serge Langlois for their efforts in successfully implementing the Procurement Strategy for Aboriginal Business (PSAB). Their collective efforts were key in increasing government procurement opportunities for Aboriginal business from \$76.5 million in 1997 to \$253 million in 2002.

THIS NEWLY CREATED MMI award is to recognize a member of the federal government's procurement and materiel management community who dedicates a significant amount of his or her time, energy and expertise to the general public.

Winner is: Gary Jeddrie, a thoroughly professional and dedicated materiel manager. A stroke some 10 years ago left Gary with partially impaired mobility, however he has given unwa-

vering and tireless dedication to the Air Cadet Movement since 1968. He willingly gives many weekends, a few week nights and some of his annual holidays to organize fundraising events, develop training plans and coordinate flights for "his" cadets. He has even been known to take on the higher echelons of DND on his cadets' behalf.
